

NL goals for a Circular Economy

- In 2050 100% circular, in 2030 half way
- Focus on three developments:
 - High quality use of raw materials in existing value chains
 - Use of sustainably produced, renewable and generally available raw materials
 - Fundamental change in production and consumption





National Agreement on Circular Economy

- Signed by more than 350 stakeholders
- Based on policy program 'The Netherlands Circular by 2050'
- Parties endorse strategic goals and sub-goals
- Only signatories are involved in developing transition agendas
- Transition Agenda's are being developed together:
 - 1. Biomass & Food
 - 2. Plastics
 - 3. Manufacturing Industries
 - 4. Building & Construction
 - 5. Consumer Goods





Transition Agenda's (1)

- Common goal : accelerate transition CE
- Urgency: CO₂-emissions, wastage of materials, environmental damage (eg plastic soup)
- Less unnecessary use, less fossil resources, less waste incineration, landfill and export
- More demand for and high quality of recycled/biobased materials (10R-ladder)










Transition Agenda's (2)

- More demand of recyclates:
 - Higher tax incineration recycleble waste
 - Extend producer responsibility
 - Enhance circular design & procurement
- More supply:
 - Mechanical/chemical recycling
 - Promoting craftmanship (Circular Craftmenship Centres)
 - Hot spots of circular business development (Silicon Valleys of the future): choose specific regional profile!
